



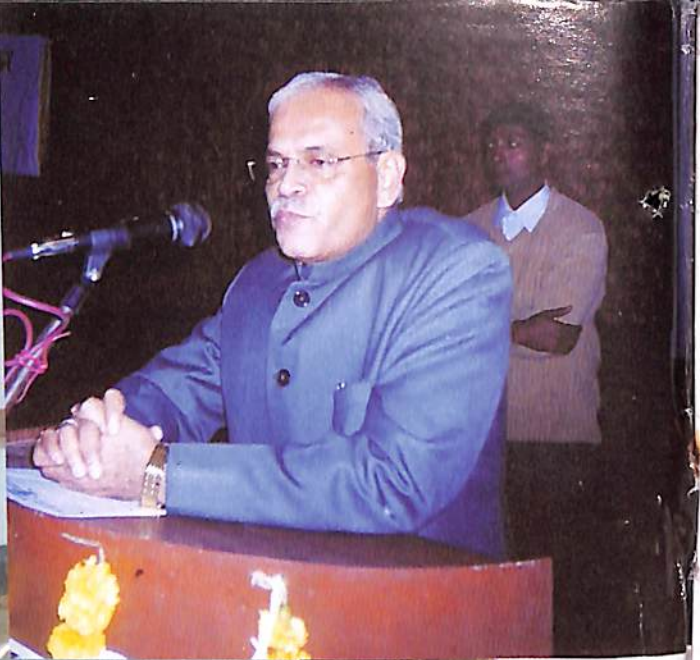

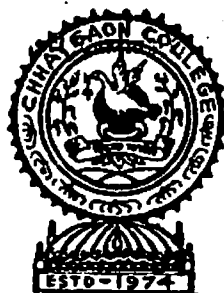

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

The history of Chhaygaon College is, without doubt, the history of higher education in the greater Chhaygaon area of South Kamrup– the homeland of heterogeneous racial elements. The establishment of this institution at Chhaygaon in 1974 is the inevitable outcome of the unceasing effort and unitiring zeal on the part of the distinguished personalities and patrons of learning of the area. The college grew healthy with the passage of time and developed, amidst numerous setbacks, into a full-fledged co-educational institution providing instruction upto degree level in Arts and Commerce faculties under the Guwahati University. The Arts stream of the college came under the Deficit system of grants-in-aid of the Govt. of Assam with effect from 01/02/1985. The Commerce stream which was introduced later is affiliated to Guwahati University from the session 1989-90. The Higher Secondary Section of the college enjoys the recognition of AHSEC.

With consistent attempt on all hands for striving towards higher levels of achievement, Chhaygaon College has made great strides in an economically backward area and has managed to bring laurels on different occasions. The college authority, in the meantime, has taken up and executed a number of projects and schemes for its infrastructural and academic acceleration.

Location Of The College :

The college is ideally situated at an easily accessible location at Chhaygaon– a place that can boast of its ethnic and cultural diversities and also of the rich heritage to which Chandika Devalaya and Chandor Merghar stand as silent testimonial. The college stands beside the National Highway No. 37 at a distance of about 40 km. West of Guwahati University and about 30 km. from the Gopinath Bordoloi Airport.

The Campus :

The college is built on an area of about 15 bighas of land under the Chhaygaon Revenue circle. The site is grand with luxuriant green fields and shady trees free from the pollution of the crowded environment and, it includes one RCC building,

two semi RCC buildings, two Assam type buildings, a large auditorium, a gymnasium hall and a medium sized playground inside the large compound. The campus maintains security all around with walls and iron gates to prevent unwanted entries.

Objectives :

The major objectives of the College are--

- * To impart, higher education by providing quality education and educational innovations.
- * To make effort with a view to preparing the pupils to face the challenges encountered by them in the modern competitive environment.
- * To provide opportunities to the students for developing their personality through community service and co-curricular activities like games & sports, music, art, culture and literature.

- * To utilize the different facilities available in the institution to maintain the quality of the academic and other aspects of the campus life for the benefit of the staff and the students.
- * To try to encourage national integration by undertaking different socio-cultural activities.
- * Besides all these, the college seeks to see how the students and teachers benefit from each other.

Vision For Future :

With the sole object of striving for higher level of achievement by providing quality education, Chhaygaon college looks forward to initiating measures relevant to regional needs like computer application, sericulture, fishery development based on the resources locally available. The college proposes to take steps to inculcate civic respon-

sibilities among the students. Assessing the importance of commerce in the global environment, the college wants to promote commerce education in this economically backward area of South Kamrup. Going beyond mere academics, the college thinks of helping students develop into culturally aware competent citizens well-prepared to take on the world.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE, ITS REQUIREMENTS & CONDITIONS

- (A) The college has a transparent admission process executed strictly on merit through entrance test, interview and academic record. Students seeking admission into different courses should apply in prescribed form which may be collected along with the Prospectus from the college office. The candidates are required to fill the relevant columns carefully and enclose all attested copies of relevant testimonials while submitting the forms to the college office on or before the due date. Incomplete and late application form, wrong options of electives will be summarily rejected.
- (B) The selection of candidates for admission is done by a Selection Committee constituted by the Principal of the college. The committee prepares the list of the selected ones and displays it on the College Notice Board well ahead of the admission dates. The selected candidates are required to get themselves admitted on the dates as notified by producing the following documents in original.
1. Mark sheet of the qualifying examination
 2. H.S.L.C. admit card
 3. Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended.
 4. Gap certificate if necessary (For students passing the qualifying examinations earlier than the current year)
 5. Caste certificate (For SC/ST/OBS/MOBC candidates). Provisional certificate will not be accepted.
 6. Certificate of proficiency in co-curricular or extra-curricular activities (if and where necessary).
- (C) Seats are limited both in H.S. & TDC courses.
- (D) Reservation of seats is as per rule.
- (E) Selection for Major is subject to the approval of the HOD concerned. Entrance test is conducted.
- (F) All admissions are provisional and subject to the approval of GU/AHSEC.
- (G) A candidate is permitted to seek admission only for one programme in a given academic session.
- (H) The college authority decides all other matters not covered by the above clauses

relating to admission & selection.

- (I) Violation of the rules results in cancellation of admission and forfeiture of admission fees.
- (J) Notices regarding admission are displayed on the College Notice Board in due course.

EVALUATION & EXAMINATION :

The college makes arrangements for overall performance of the students through regular assessment. The evaluation and examination process comprises Assignments, Unit Test, Terminal Examination and Test. Students are required to sit for all these examinations failing which they will not be allowed to appear in the examinations conducted by AHSEC/G.U.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

The following rules and regulations are to be strictly followed by the students—

- (A) Attendance in class is compulsory. Each student is required to attend a minimum of 75% classes held in one academic year, failing which he/she will be declared NON-COLLEGIATE. A student failing to attend a minimum of 50% of the classes will not be eligible to sit for the final Examination.
- (B) A student must not abstain from attending SEMINARS, MEETINGS & other Functions in the college.
- (C) A student must carry the identity card issued by the college authority in the college premises and must produce it if and when necessary. He/She must surrender the identity card at the time of receiving pass/transfer certificate.
- (D) Use of indecent language, ungentlemanly conduct, ragging in any form, teasing, showing disregard to the teachers and office staff, violation of the examination rules, damage to college property, will definitely invite stern disciplinary action.
- (E) Alcoholic consumption in the college campus, loitering in front of the class rooms or in the corridors one strictly forbidden.
- (F) No society or organization can be formed in the college nor shall any person be invited to address a meeting in the college premises without the prior permission of the college authority or the Principal of the college.
- (G) All powers for maintenance of discipline one vested with the Principal of the college.

The college tries its best to maintain peace and harmony among the students and wants each and every student to uphold and preserve this tradition.

COLLEGE TRANSFER CERTIFICATE

Application to the Principal for transfer certificate on valid ground must be accompanied by clearance certificate from—

- (a) College Office
- (b) Librarian
- (c) Vice-President (CCSU)

and a certificate showing record of attendance from the head of the departments

concerned. The student has to pay Rs. 15/- for a Transfer certificate and Rs. 10/- for a Pass/Character certificate.

FACILITIES & FEATURES

Library :

Housed on the north side of the campus, the college library has a rich collection of books and periodicals with separate study spaces for the teachers and the students. The college authority has, in the meantime, taken ambitious schemes to bring about a major change through its development. The library remains open for six hours from 10 A.M. to 4 P.M. on all working days. Students and teachers have open access and can borrow books for 15 days from the date of issue. A fine is imposed upon the defaulting students. The final examination question papers of AHSEC & GU are also available at the library at a nominal cost. The members of the library staff are always ready to help the readers.

Departmental Common Room :

The college authority has undertaken schemes to provide each teaching department of the college with a well-equipped common room.

College Auditorium :

An auditorium with a capacity to accommodate about one thousand students provides facilities for students' activities, meetings, conference etc.

Common Rooms For boys And Girls :

The college provides separate common rooms for boys and girls with facilities for recreation.

Gymnasium :

The students of the college are encouraged to understand the need for physical by making the best use of the hall.

The College Canteen :

The old college canteen is being revived and renovated with the object of supplying fresh food to teachers, students and non teaching staff of the college of a reasonable rate.

The College Magazine :

The college issues its magazine 'KALAH!' every year regularly and, it includes

contributions from the students and the staff members. In addition to that, a wall magazine published periodically encourages the students for literary achievements and exposure.

Students' Union :

Chhaygaon College Students' Union is constituted annually as per rules provided in the constitution of the Union. The Union plays an important role in the college by organising different students' activities, competitions, functions and festivals in co-operation with the college authority. The membership to the Union is compulsory for every student.

National Service Scheme :

The National Service (NSS) unit of Chhaygaon college develops a sense of social responsibility in students through a variety of community service and welfare activities like voluntary health service, child welfare, adult literacy, relief programme, environment awareness etc both inside and outside the college.

Bharat Scouts And Guides :

The college has introduced 'Bharat Scouts and Guides' to inculcate the spirit of discipline, physical fitness & character-building in the students.

Computer Application Programme :

The college is introducing a short-term programme in Computer Application.

Career Counselling & Information Guidance :

Chhaygaon college provides career counselling and information guidance to create awareness about career prospects, employment etc. for the greater benefit of the student community.

Academic Society & Students' Activities :

A few Associations in the college like 'Social Science Study Forum', 'Sahitya Chora' undertake and carry out academic/co-curricular activities like seminar, extension, lecture, field study, survey etc. with the involvement of the teachers and the students with a view to creating an academic and cultural atmosphere of general nature.

Alumni Association :

Chhaygaon College Alumni Association is formally organised with elected office bearers pledging to work for the progress of the college. The purpose of the

association is to being together the various alumni on a common platform to give an impetus to the all-round development of the college.

Students' Aid Fund :

The college has established a Students' Aid Fund to extend financial help to the poor but meritorious and physically handicapped students.
